


Unhurried Easter

Easter Surveying

"When I survey the wondrous cross, on which the Prince of Glory died."

"When I survey the wondrous cross" is one of those dearly loved hymns that have stood the test of time, although it was written by Isaac Watts over 300 years ago. This is an Easter season hymn that gathers our eyes to the last hours of our Lord Jesus on the cross at Calvary.

I think it is the opening line that has helped to make this hymn so popular throughout the ages. The word "survey" in this line means much more than just, "have a look"!

When a teacher is working with a class of students, she or he will say, "Eyes and ears to the front please everyone". With these or similar words, the teacher is gathering the full attention of the class so that all the students can tune into something important.

If we were using expressions of the 1700s, the teacher might say, "Survey me, everyone." Alas in our modern world, students who heard that might think that their teacher wants them to get out compasses, theodolites and other surveyor's equipment.

To survey the "wondrous cross" means to: "pause", "stop and look", "crunch up our eyebrows and think deeply", "ask what am I learning here?" and "wonder what this all means?". The hymn writer tells us to direct all these "surveying" kind of thoughts to Jesus on His cross.

A blessed Easter weekend to you and your loved ones, as together we pause to "survey the wondrous cross, on which the Prince of Glory died" on Good Friday.

We have held swimming carnivals, the Year 3-12 Cross Country Carnival (on the last day of this term), had district trials with many students being selected at both District and Regional level, Monday night netball, rugby, soccer and volleyball competitions.

In the past week, we have had an explosion of outstanding results and achievements:

PLC Rugby

The 1st XV rugby team has recorded three wins from their first three games, defeating Unity College last Wednesday 19-13 in a hard-fought match. It was also GREAT to see some of the other Year 12 students showing up to the game and supporting the rugby boys in their match. The BIG match however, is in the first week back next term, when Pacific takes on Immanuel Lutheran College in the Lutheran Rugby Cup. Immanuel gained the urn after beating Pacific last year, but 2014 is the year that Pacific takes it back. Mr MacLeod is confident that he has the team to do it! All the best to the boys.

We also have our 13 years rugby team playing on a Wednesday and, although they have lost a few of their opening games, they are progressing along well and really starting to

PLC Netball

Round 6 Monday night netball:

PLC Soccer (Wednesday Night Finals)

This term, Pacific soccer has dominated the SCISSA competition, having both our teams (senior boys and senior girls) qualify for the finals on Wednesday night. The senior girls had to first play a semi-final match against Immanuel Lutheran College to determine who was to play in the Grand Final. The girls managed a 2-1 victory over Immanuel on our home fields, in a nail-biting game where it was anyone's match up until the final siren. They then went on to play against an undefeated Suncoast Christian College team in the final at Matthew Flinders.



All girls played extremely well and should be commended on their enthusiasm and sportsmanship in the match. The game ended up being a heart stopper with scores tied at 3 - 3 with only a few minutes left in the game. Unfortunately the opposition scored the match winning goal before the full-time siren sounded and we lost 3 - 4. Well done on a great season girls!



The senior boys also played in the Final at Matthew Flinders, coming up against Sunshine Coast Grammar School in a tough match (SCGS had previously beaten Pacific in the preliminary rounds). On the night however, there was some outstanding performances by all the boys and Pacific put up a good fight, unfortunately the opposition proved to be too strong and we lost 0 - 2.

Kaylee McKeown has been selected in the Australian Age Swimming Championships and is competing in two weeks. Last week she competed in the Qld State Swimming Titles and won three gold medals in the backstroke (50m, 100m and

200m) at the meet. She also broke two records on the day and missed out by 0.02 second on breaking Olympic swimmer Emily Seebohm's backstroke record! Congratulations Kaylee on all of your achievements. We all look forward to hearing how you go over the rest of the year.

Kieran Bergs has also had a great swim meet at the Qld State Swimming Titles, receiving a bronze medal in the 50m freestyle and claiming GOLD in the 100m freestyle event. This outstanding result has come off the back of many hours of hard work and it is great to see Kieran's success in the pool. This has led to Kieran qualifying to represent Qld at the Australian championships in October! Well done, Kieran.



Beau Blake has recently competed in the Australian Kite Surfing championships. Beau came 4th in Australia and is following closely in the footsteps of past Pacific scholar and World Champion Kite Surfer, Andy Yates. Congratulations Beau.

Caitlin Gilliman has also had some major success in kayaking early in the year. Over the past two months, Caitlin has been selected in Regional, State and now Australian kayaking teams! Caitlin has just been announced that she has qualified for the Australian team in sprint kayaking and will fly to Germany and Hungary to compete in the World Championships. To be selected on this Australian team, Caitlin medalled in both the 200m and 500m Kayak National Championship events held last week in Adelaide. She has also been selected to train at the AIS with the Open Women's team before heading off to Italy to compete at the European Championships. This is a tremendous achievement for a very talented athlete. Congratulations Caitlin!
